Fire danger is **MODERATE** for most of the state except for southern Vermont where Rh is higher and winds are lighter. A few rain showers dampened fuels overnight last night for some of the state, but above normal temps, moderate Rh and gusty winds today have kept fire danger at moderate.

Showers are expected tomorrow but fire danger will likely remain **MODERATE** until rain arrives. The extended forecast is for widespread rain on Friday, continuing into Saturday, see precipitation forecast map below from the National Weather Service in Burlington.
