Fire danger today is **MODERATE**. After several days of rain and snow showers, the weather pattern has shifted today to a more typical April fire season pattern. Fuels have begun to dry with lots of sun, moderate Rh and generally light winds. Open burning is allowed with a permit from the fire warden.

Tomorrow, the dry weather pattern will continue will clear skies and lower Rh. Winds are expected to be light. Fine grass and leaf fuels will have another day of drying, thus fire danger is likely to be **HIGH**. This weather is expected to continue through the weekend.
