Fire danger today is **HIGH** with a VERY HIGH at the Nulhegan RAWs. Mostly sunny skies and warmer temps have combined with very low Rh and a stiff breeze with occasional gusts to dry fine grass and brush fuels. These 1hr fuels are very dry today and will burn readily. Open burning should only be allowed where local conditions are favorable and only with a permit from the fire warden, however, many wardens are not issuing permits at this time.

This dry weather pattern continues tomorrow with Rh lower than today and a steady breeze. Fine grass and leaf fuels will remain very dry and fire danger will remain **HIGH**. This weather pattern is expected to continue through the weekend before a chance of showers is forecast late on Monday.
