Fire danger today is **HIGH** to **VERY HIGH**. Rh statewide is in the single digits/teens to low 20% range drying 1hr and 10 hr fuels to critically dry conditions. These grass, leaf and brush fuels are highly combustible and will ignite readily from any heat source. On the plus side, winds are mostly light, however, given these desert dry conditions, open burning is not recommended until conditions improve.

Dry again tomorrow but Rh will be slightly higher (20% range) and winds remain mostly light. However, with the on-going dry condition of the fuels, fire danger will remain **HIGH**. This weather pattern is expected to continue through the weekend before a chance of showers is forecast late on Monday.
