Fire danger is **MODERATE to HIGH today**. Northern Vermont is seeing some partly to mostly cloudy skies this afternoon with moderate Rh. Showers are just moving into areas near the Canadian border. Elsewhere in the state, warmer temps, more sun and drier air is keeping fire danger high. Fuels are still very dry everywhere until rain comes. Given the dry state of these fuels, open burning is not recommended unless a location has received some rain.

The National Weather Service has issued a **Fire Weather Watch** for Addison, Washington, Orange, Rutland, Windsor, Bennington and Windham counties. These counties are not expected to receive more than .1" of rain or less overnight. Winds will become gusty and Rh's will be below 30%. A Red Flag Warning may be issued tomorrow morning to upgrade the fire weather watch. Fire danger will be **HIGH** in these counties. **OPEN BURNING IS NOT RECOMMENDED IN THE WATCH AREA.**

The northern counties are expected to receive between .10 to .25" of rain overnight. Tomorrow, winds will not be a strong and Rh will not be as low as the central and southern counties. Fire danger in northern Vermont will be **MODERATE**.
