Fire danger is **HIGH** and **VERY HIGH** today. Warm temps and extremely low Rh have dried grass, leaf and brush fuels to critical levels. These 1 and 10 hr fuels are extremely dry today and will burn readily. Winds are generally light but occasional gusts could easily carry a spark into these dry fuels for a rapid ignition. Open burning is not advised for the remainder of the day due to these extremely dry conditions.

Some rain showers and cloud cover are expected overnight tonight with a better chance tomorrow. However, these showers will be light and will only dampen fuels, not eliminate the long term dryness. Winds are expected to be gusty as well, keeping fire danger at least **MODERATE**.
