Fire danger today is **MODERATE**. Warm temps and moderate RH are keeping fire danger moderate despite greening. Grass and other herbaceous fuels across the state are generally green enough now to keep fire danger in check. Leaf out has advanced in the last few days with warmer temps and will continue to do so this week as warm temps remain in the forecast. While not fully leafed out at all elevations, some shading to the forest is still occurring and has a moderating effect on fire danger. Open burning is allowed where fuels and winds are favorable.

A chance of light showers in forecast tomorrow along with partly to mostly cloudy skies and higher Rh. Fire danger will be LOW to MODERATE depending on where showers occur.
