Fire danger today is **LOW**. Partly to mostly cloudy skies and high Rh has kept fuel damp and fire danger low. Tomorrow, in northern Vermont, partly to mostly sunny skies and warmer temps will allow Rh to decrease. Fire danger is expected to be **MODERATE** in areas with concentrations of dead fuels especially forest fuels. Southern Vermont is expected to see more cloud cover and higher Rh, keeping fire danger **LOW**. Open burning is allowed where fuel and wind conditions are favorable.
