Fire danger for Vermont today is **MODERATE** statewide and will likely continue at **MODERATE** through the weekend into early next week.

KBDI values and other fire danger indices continue to indicate drier than normal ground and large diameter dead fuels (1000-hr) as well as potential for an increase in fire activity (ERC). Western and southern Vermont are drier than the rest of the state, but the central and northeast regions are starting to dry out also. If this dry weather pattern continues after a killing frost and leaf drop, the fire danger adjective will climb to high as well. Keep these factors in mind before any open burning.
