Fire danger is **LOW**. Rain yesterday along with partly to mostly cloudy skies, high Rh and light winds today have kept surface fuels damp and fire danger low. The rain did little to alleviate the long term dryness.

Tomorrow a return to dry weather with more sun, warmer temps and lower Rh will bring fire danger back to **MODERATE**.
