Fire danger is MODERATE for most of the state except the southern most part where Rh is higher and fuels are damper. KBDI's continue to climb at Essex and Danby and 1000hr dead fuels are much drier than normal at these sites. The most recent US Drought Monitor remains similar to last week with Addison, Rutland, Windsor, most of Chittenden, and Windham in moderate drought. The rest of the state is abnormally dry except for Caledonia and southern Essex counties. Follow current drought conditions at <http://droughtmonitor.unl.edu/>. Current conditions are updated every Thursday.

Tomorrow will be partly cloudy, dry with light winds. Fire danger will be LOW to MODERATE.
