The wet weather pattern for June continues as does **Low** fire danger. The significant amount of rain we have received, now statewide, since the beginning of June has saturated soils as well as surface

fuels as indicated by very low KBDI values. Note the rain totals received at the Vermont fire weather stations (left) comparing the total rain received in May to the first 16 days of June. Also remember most of the May total came on May 31st. Above normal rain is forecast through June 26 continuing low fire danger.
