Amphibian/Reptile Survey Methods:

Survey for amphibians and reptiles was purposefully biased toward sampling known habitats. Habitats were determined through natural community delineation according to Thompson and Sorenson (2001) criteria.

Night Time Road Searches

Eight hours were spent in early June 2001 driving ½ mile of paved road and ½ mile of dirt road on warm, rainy nights within Gale Meadows WMA. Amphibians found were captured, photographed, and released.

Active Searches

Active searches were used to find amphibians and reptiles during June, July, and August 2001. Sites were visited five days in June, ten days in July, and seven days in August. Eight different natural communities were searched and microhabitats found therein were closely examined. Individuals found were caught and photographed.

Forex Inventory Plots

A total of 16 - 26.4 feet radius plots were taken in two days to assess forest ecology on the higher elevations of the property. Plots were located on transect lines based on a 10-chain grid. All microhabitats within the plot were examined and captures were photographed.
