  - Site amenities (campgrounds, parking lots, accessibility, etc)
  - o Roads
  - Waterways/bodies
- Project information
  - Proposed location of project can be approximate
  - Proposed access to project site, if relevant

If possible, please also send digital geographic information for the project. This could include:

- Shapefile or Feature Class
- KML (Google Earth)
- GPX (GPS file)
- Georeferenced map suitable to use in Avenza
